<p>1 OAKLAWN PARK R6 (3:46 CT) 32 MDN CLM 25K, 1M 1/16 DIRT</p> <p>2 TROPHY DADDY 15-1 5 CADDO DADDO 7-2 10 BABADOOOK 2-1 4 SUSPICIOUS EYES 20-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 2 TROPHY DADDY</u> Was nearly 30-1 in the debut against quite a few of these. He missed the break and was lagging far behind before he made a decent move to split the field. He is bred to go long and should be better suited second out. Has a rider who gets in with light weight in here.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 SUSPICIOUS EYES</u> He technically has the top two Beyers in the field when he got a 59 on the turf in the first start at FG and then a 50 four back at RP. He hasn't run much in the two starts here this meet but did try to run with the wire to wire dropper in last before tiring. Crafty rider up. A) 2,5,10 B) 1,4,6,7,11,12 C) 3</p>	<p>2 OAKLAWN PARK R7 (4:14 CT) 32 OPT CLM 93K, 1M DIRT</p> <p>2 BOURBON COWBOY 5-2 5 MAJESTIC AFFAIR 3-1 1 SEVIER 6-1 3 SUMMER REVOLUTION 8-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 2 BOURBON COWBOY</u> Big run for 2nd behind an Asmussen sprinter star Mitole (won 5 of 6 and will be seen later in the year in the BC Sprint). He was good in the King Cotton two back when he was just a length behind in the end. Last win was vs a talented MN-bred Hot Shot Kid. Gets the trip.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 1 SEVIER</u> Won't be much of a mystery what tactics will be employed here. He is the speed and gets a rail draw. Notice he's had the rail last two times and he's won and ran 2nd in a key race last out. Two next out winners and two more ran 2nd out of that race. 4 for 7 top two here. A) 2,5 B) 1,3 C) 4,6,7,8</p>	<p>3 OAKLAWN PARK R8 (4:42 CT) 73 OPT CLM 93K, 6F DIRT</p> <p>9 GREELEY AND BEN 6-1 8 HAMMERIN AAMER 2-1 3 MO'S MOJO 9-2 6 ALTITO 12-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 9 GREELEY AND BEN</u> His dam was a router for these connections graded stakes placed. This one has physical issues, was off 15 months before last. That wasn't a bad run sprinting where he made an early move. Beat multiple graded stakes winner Hence in his 2nd start. Expect better.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 6 ALTITO</u> 5YO gelding might need a race or two before he is at his best. Notice he won at 6-1 in his second start off the layoff. Middling effort in the comebacker last out but the 5 wide trip didn't help matters. The longer the better so may be sharper later. Can still use him here. A) 3,8,9 B) 1,2,4,6 C) 5,7</p>	<p>4 OAKLAWN PARK R9 (5:10 CT) 85 MSW 90K, 6F DIRT</p> <p>8 SHILAH BABY 7-2 10 U. S. CURRENCY 6-1 9 TRACI'S GREELEY 10-1 1 MISS DARLEY 5-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 8 SHILAH BABY</u> Took all the money in the debut despite that wide draw. She ran up with the leaders in a hot pace, made an early move to the lead in a wide position and just tired late. Comes in with a bullet move. Trainer is 17% with 1strs but 38% 2nd out in MSW sprinting on the dirt.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 10 U. S. CURRENCY</u> Never been worse than 4th in career starts. She cuts back in distance here and makes her first start sprinting on a fast dirt track in this spot. Winner 2 back returned to win an op clm here for Asmussen by 5 lengths. 3rd and 4th both hit the board vs MSW next out. A) 8 B) 1,4,9,10,11 C) 2,6,7</p>
<p>5 SUNLAND PARK R8 (4:57 CT) 80 HARRY HENSEN 100K, 1M DIRT</p> <p>6 ESCAPE CLAUSE 5-2 4 CLEVER SERVE 5-1 5 THE INCIDENT 8-1 1 HEAVENHASMNIKKI 2-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 5 ESCAPE CLAUSE</u> She was the talk of Santa Anita after a huge early move in the G3 two back that carried her to a strong win. Runner she beat there had beaten 5 of the foes in here previously in New Mexico. This mare really knows how to win; 19 victories in her 29 career starts.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 CLEVER SERVE</u> Asmussen mare ships in from the stronger Oaklawn Park circuit where she won a race and was a strong third. Was very wide last out on a track that favored inside speed at the meet. She is 6 for 7 in the money at this distance. Would be tough if the pace melts. A) 6 B) 1,4,5 C) 2,3,8</p>	<p>6 SUNLAND PARK R9 (5:27 CT) 84 SUNLAND PARK OAKS 200K, 1M 1/16 DIRT</p> <p>9 BELLAFINA 7-5 7 CHASING YESTERDAY 9-5 2 PARADE OF ROSES 10-1 5 BACKFLASH 6-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 9 BELLAFINA</u> Classy filly ships in from Southern California where she was last seen gamely winning G2 Las Virgenes. She was 1-9 in there and really got tested by the same runner who was 2nd to Chasing Yesterday start prior. Only losses were in debut sprinting & in the BC Juv Filly.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 2 PARADE OF ROSES</u> Many in here come out of the 75k stake here that served as a prep for this race. This filly was on the rail and traveling dead last back of a slow early pace. She did make up some ground to finish a decent 4th but was 7 wide doing so. Could be passing them again late. A) 7,9 B) C) 1,2,3,5,6,8</p>	<p>7 SUNLAND PARK R10 (5:58 CT) 82 BOB THOMAS 100K, 6.5F DIRT</p> <p>3 CHIEF CICATRIZ 3-1 9 ALL OUT BLITZ 5-2 2 ANYPORTINASTORM 4-1 1 LIMATION 8-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 3 CHIEF CICATRIZ</u> Started his career by winning four straight in New Mexico before taking his talents to national scene. Won the Phoenix Gold Cup twice in a row and crushed a good field in the G3 at CD two back when he went from 5-1 to 2-1 at post. Hand-ridden in last start.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 1 LIMATION</u> Could make an excuse for this one. Was on off-tracks in the last two, steadied badly in the start 3 back and was burned up on the pace in the starts prior. Upset the G3 Super Derby six starts back. Cuts back in distance for this. Cannot ignore these connections. A) 3,9 B) 1,2 C) 5,6,8</p>	<p>8 SUNLAND PARK R11 (6:30 CT) 76 SUNLAND DERBY-G3 800K, 1M 1/8 DIRT</p> <p>5 CUTTING HUMOR 8-1 2 ANOTHERWISTAFATE 3-1 1 MUCHO GUSTO 8-5 4 WICKED INDEED 6-1</p> <p><u>PICK: 5 CUTTING HUMOR</u> This female family produced some strong runners like G1 winners Zensational & Trip. Was favored in the G3 Southwest but was roughed up and steadied into the first turn and then was flat late. 2nd from there ran 3rd at 8-1 in the La Derby. 3rd won the G2 Rebel.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 2 ANOTHERWISTAFATE</u> Dominating winner of three starts on the synthetic at GG. He beat a very nice Baffert runner in the El Camino Real last out. Might have taken advantage of being on a lonely lead in slow fractions there (as he did in his previous two outs). Well-bred and talented. A) 1,2,5 B) 3,4 C) 6,7,9</p>
