

1 1/2 MILES. (224) 146TH RUNNING OF THE BELMONT. Grade I. Purse \$1,500,000 FOR THREE YEAR OLDS. By subscription of \$600 each, to accompany the nomination, if made on or before January 25, 2014, or \$6,000, if made on or before March 22, 2014. At any time prior to the closing time of entries, horses may be nominated to The Belmont Stakes upon payment of a supplementary fee of \$75,000 to the New York Racing Association, Inc. \$15,000 to pass the entry box and \$15,000 additional to start. All entrants will be required to pay entry and starting fees; but no fees, supplemental or otherwise shall be added to the purse. The purse to be divided \$800,000 to the winner, \$280,000 to second, \$150,000 to third, \$100,000 to fourth, \$60,000 to fifth, \$45,000 to sixth, \$35,000 to seventh and \$30,000 to eighth. Colts and Geldings, 126 lbs.; Fillies, 121 lbs. The winning owner will be presented with the August Belmont Memorial Cup to be retained for one year as well as a trophy for permanent possession and trophies to the winning trainer and jockey.

TONALIST was strung out four to five wide on the first turn, joined up with the front runners and pressed the issue outside them to the quarter pole, was set down spinning four wide into the lane, gradually cut into the lead, lugged inward deep stretch, carrying in MEDAL COUNT, continued on determinedly to wear down COMMISSIONER. COMMISSIONER launched a three wide run to take charge, tucked along the rail coming to the beginning of the backstretch, rated kindly while feeling the presence of a pair of opponents heading for the half mile pole, was still being challenged by the them all during the run around the far turn, got put to a drive a few strides before reaching the quarter pole, dug in with good determination only to be nailed at the finish. MEDAL COUNT bobbed at the start, took the inside route to the five-sixteenths marker before being eased into the two path, angled sharply three wide into the stretch, was forced in several paths by the winner inside the sixteenth pole, held well for the show. CALIFORNIA CHROME stumbled outward, brushing with MATTERHORN at the start, showed no ill effects and settled into a forward position, took the two path around the clubhouse turn, awaited an opportunity to move further towards the outside making his way down the backstretch, nudged aside WICKED STRONG to take over the fourth position with five furlongs to go, continued from well off the rail on the far turn, ranged up and was set down coming five wide into the stretch, failed to pick up the pace appreciably, held on well to gain an equal share of the last major check. WICKED STRONG was three wide heading for the end of the homestretch, was alongside SAMRAAT when drifting inward slightly, putting that foe in tight quarters, raced between rivals early down the backstretch looking for an opportunity to get maneuvered outward, worked his way into four path after six furlongs, had that path taken over by CALIFORNIA CHROME shortly afterwards, continued from well off the rail and lacked the necessary stretch response. SAMRAAT got steadied while in tight nearing the beginning of the first turn, raced in the two path down the backstretch, began to swing outward after going halfway around the second bend and steadily cut into the margin, angled six wide into the stretch, began to lug in almost immediately afterwards and flattened out. GENERAL A ROD four wide entering the opening bend, spun into the backstretch one path closer to the rail, drew alongside COMMISSIONER and prompted the pace from the two path, remained reserved while continuing at the task until approaching the quarter pole, got asked for some run challenging in earnest as the field headed into the stretch, kept up the pursuit for an additional furlong then backed away. MATTERHORN bumped lightly with CALIFORNIA CHROME just after the start, went on to save ground to no avail. COMMANDING CURVE took up position in midpack, was in the two path and asked for run midway around the far turn, came up empty and gave way. MATUSZAK raced primarily two wide for the opening mile, never reached a contending position and was eased down the stretch. RIDE ON CURLIN raced from off the inside throughout, was between rivals for a good portion of the way down the backstretch, entered

the far turn from the four path, was placed closer to the rail shortly afterwards, arrived at the quarter pole with little left and was eased.
