1st: 5 MISS SURPRISE
 Trainer has had 11 straight races where he ran 1st or 2nd on the dirt (all here at GP). Came off the layoff and move over to this trainer and crushed 4 overmatched opponents. The rider winning 50% for this trainer. Second in last returned to run 2nd again at this level 5th straight runner-up in a row.

VALUE: 1 FERGIELICIOUS
 Last two times she was in a claiming race she won. Those starts came here last May. Faced opt clm company in the two starts since and ran decently vs better. Regular rider is off to the runner to her outside. Will save ground in here.

1st: 3 THE KID IN SYD
 Has nibbled vs better before the drop in last. He made an early move to the lead before fading a bit. Checked twice 2 back on the grass. Winner three back was 3rd in an opt clm next and then beaten 4 lengths in a 60k stakes at 14-1. His rider is off to the other McPeek runner. He'll get good trip.

VALUE: 4 BEACH RESORT
 Late runner takes a pretty significant drop in class after a 6th place finish vs a 35k claiming group. Was 4th three back vs MSW. Winner in last came back to run 2nd in opt clm last week. Will be better at this level vs a somewhat weak field.

1st: 1 DR HARLAN
 Claimed for the second time in a row last out. He may not have wanted the off-going in there. Gets blinkers removed and a huge rider change for this. 7YO gelding clearly has a few physical issues as he's only had 10 starts but finds soft foes for this one. Looking for a rebound from his last start.

VALUE: 3 GOLDEN KANTHAROS
 Has two runner-up finishes in a row at this level. Getting to the winner last out at 8-1. Trainer won just 7% last year so that is a bit problematic. Faces a very soft field here and a repeat of his last 2 starts might be enough to win vs these.

1st: 4 PRETTY LADY
 Rushed up for 2nd behind the favorite, A Thread of Blue, in the 100k Dania Beach. The extra distance will help him in here if someone makes the favorite work hard enough in the early part of the race. Pace two back was just too slow for him to make up late ground. Rider change to Irad Ortiz.

VALUE: 3 KING OTTOKAR
 Very well-bred for the grass with both Dynamformer and El Prado influence. Leparoux took him wire to wire in last in what is turning out to be a key race. 3rd, 4th, 5th from there all came back to win. Nice worktab coming into this race.

1st: 1 SIEM RIEP
 Was one of many who came out of the 100k El Prado here on Feb 9th. He was traveling up near the very fast pace and it wasn't a surprise that he faded. Looks like he'll be a lone speed from the rail, and one the others will allow to draw off. Very dangerous if he can gear it down to a 49 half-mile.

VALUE: 5 KRAMPUS
 Was rolling in the lane in the El Prado but was steadied in a tough spot late in the race and lost all chance. He was just outside the winner late. Mott having a big meet. Big rider move to Velazquez (1 for 1 on him). He'll be finishing quick.

1st: 1 RECRUITING READY
 Major speed and draws the inside. Would expect the rider to go and force the others to try and catch him. Ran 2nd to a superstar sprinter, World of Trouble, in last and was well clear of 3rd. Forced to duel early with the likes of XY Jet and Imperial Hint. There just isn't that kind of pace in this one.

VALUE: 8 STORM ADVISORY
 He was an 80k claim five starts back and is turning out to be a good move. The runner-up finish two back behind the Pletcher trained Coal Front (won the G3 Razorback next) is a giant effort. 3rd, 4th out of there also won in a stakes next.

<p>7 VERY ONE-G3 150K, 1M 3/16 TURF 56</p> <p>5 LAFTA 10-1 1 DANCELAND 6-1 3 HOLY HELENA 9-5 4 SEMPER SENTENTIAE 7-2</p> <p><u>1st: 5 LAFTA</u> Drew the 14 post in the G3 back in Mid Dec. That was a tough draw in that strong field and she went wide but finished nicely for 5th at 8-1. 4th and 10th from that race came back to win 150k stakes next out. Had two strong wins here after coming over from France. Worked well for this for Biancone. Trainer does well off of breaks of this kind.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 1 DANCELAND</u> Won two straight with Velazquez aboard in the fall at Saratoga. Faced some of the top female turf runners, on softer turf, in two starts after. Last 2 were better than they appear. Pulling, 5 wide two back. Steadied twice last out. Winner of last start won the G3 La Prv at 8-1 here next out. Strong drills. A) 1,3,5 B) 4,7 C) 2,6,8</p>	<p>8 HCMBRIDE-G3 150K, 1M 1/16 TURF 42</p> <p>6 GOLCONDA 3-1 8 CONNECTIVITY 4-1 4 MY GAL BETTY 6-1 7 CAMBIER PARC 2-1</p> <p><u>1st: 6 GOLCONDA</u> One of three here for Chad Brown. It would be surprising if he has nearly half the field and doesn't win. He has a good record w/ those shipping in from Europe. He has a 7 for 16 record (with 12 in the money) with a shipper from overseas for this ownership. Castellano hitting at 33% when aboard for Brown at GP. Drills well-spaced and sharp.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 MY GAL BETTY</u> Won first three starts for Canadian outfit before a nice runner-up finish in a G1 two back at Woodbine. Willing to give a pass in the BC Juv Fillies Turf. She drew the 13 post and was 9 wide, a nearly impossible trip to compete in that field. Trainer not great w/ a comebacker of this type. Shows up late. A) 4,6,7,8 B) 2,3,5 C) 1</p>	<p>9 MSW 50K, 1M 1/16 TURF 41</p> <p>10 LADY ROSALIE 12-1 6 CHAMPAGNE DIET 20-1 13 CHOATE BRIDGE 5-1 5 SAN SARIA 10-1</p> <p><u>1st: 10 LADY ROSALIE</u> Drew wide in her debut. She ended up far behind early and made up some ground in late stages without threatening. Trainer is 0 for 19 with a firster on grass with just one in the money. He improves to 18% win and 55% in the money with a 2nd timer on grass. Bred to be nice. Sib is 8x turf winner Summer Front (winner of \$1M, G1 placed).</p> <p><u>VALUE: 6 CHAMPAGNE DIET</u> Trainer has just 1 win with a first timer in 40 starts and is 1 for 5 with a 1st timer here on the turf in MSW going long. That winner was the half sib to this one, last year, here on the grass (Hawkish) at 10-1. The works on this one are similar maybe a bit better. Second dam won \$1.4M on grass for Toner. A) 5,6,10,13 B) 3,4,9 C) 1,2,7,8,12</p>	<p>10 MSW 50K, 1M 1/16 DIRT 74</p> <p>8 RANGER UP 5-1 4 IDENTIFIER 7-2 6 FELIX THE FOX 4-1 7 HIGH AMPLITUDE 9-2</p> <p><u>1st: 8 RANGER UP</u> Added blinkers in his last start and drew a 13 post in a race that saw a special runner (Hidden Scroll) explode away from them in the lane. This one tried to move into that impressive winner while wide and rather expectedly tired a bit. Sib to the G1 winner Mastery (Baffert) who won the G1 Cash Call '16. 4th from last ran 2nd neck in MSW next.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 IDENTIFIER</u> Also comes out of the race won by Hidden Scroll. He was favored in that race after 3 runner-up finishes in a row, Jorge Navarro. Had a tough task of running with the quick winner early and then tired. He veered out at the start which may have cost him a bit. Back w/ a sizzling bullet drill here on 2/16. A) 8 B) 2,4,6,7 C) 1,3,5</p>
<p>11 HONEY FOX-G3 150K, 1M TURF 73</p> <p>1 PRECIEUSE 7-2 10 DOLCE LILI 4-1 4 LA SIGNARE 6-1 2 VALEDICTORIAN 6-1</p> <p><u>1st: 1 PRECIEUSE</u> Same connections who have champ grass mare Sistercharlie, who similarly came in from France, ran once (2nd a neck in the G1 Belmont Oaks) went to the shelf and came back to win the G1 J Wiley. Just like her star stablemate, this one was a Group 1 winner in FR. Winner of last won a G3 and a G1 in next two. Going to be tough if she's ready.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 LA SIGNARE</u> Another filly who ran in France and is now a graded stakes winner in the US. Went all the way on the front at Belmont to win the Wonder Again at 6-1. Pace was faster in G1 Belmont Oaks two back. Went off favored last out but was pretty flat. Comes back w/ sharper drills and Ortiz remains up today. A) 1 B) 2,4,8,9,10 C) 3,5,6,7</p>	<p>12 DAVANA DALE-G2 150K, 1M TURF 96</p> <p>1 JAYWALK 2-5 5 CHAMPAGNE ANYONE 6-1 2 COOKIE DOUGH 20-1 7 HIGH REGARD 9-2</p> <p><u>1st: 1 JAYWALK</u> Dominates three pillars of handicapping. She's the class, speed and projects to get the run of the race as controlling speed from the rail. Really strong win last out in the G1 BC Juv Fillies at 6-1. Rosario is in for the ride. Normally a good angle to try and beat those G1 winners coming off a break after career effort. Not in this spot though.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 5 CHAMPAGNE ANYONE</u> Street Sense filly is going to be at her best going long so last can be viewed as a prep for this spot. Ran in the G2 Golden Rod two back and was traveling well before being a bit shuffled on the turn. Had to alter three back when she got up to win at KEE. Think there is more in the tank than we've seen. A) 1 B) C) 2,5,6,7</p>	<p>13 FOY-G2 400K, 1M 1/16 DIRT 82</p> <p>7 HIDDEN SCROLL 9-5 5 VEKOMA 7-2 6 SIGNALMAN 9-2 1 CODE OF HONOR 6-1</p> <p><u>1st: 7 HIDDEN SCROLL</u> Bettors will be polarized determining how to handle this 2nd timer for Bill Mott. Was a sensational winner in the debut earning a 104 Beyer. That was on the lead on a wet track that favored speed so that is where the doubters will hang their hat. The works were superb prior to the race and he took early action. He can be any kind of runner.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 1 CODE OF HONOR</u> Wire to wire winner in the debut for a very conservative trainer. Was thought to be G1 material after that debut as they tried him in the G1 Champagne and he ran huge for 2nd after an awful start. Had physical issue that kept him out of the BC Juv (scratched on day). Working like he's better than last. A) 5,6,7 B) 1,4,8 C) 2,9</p>	<p>13 MDIARMND-G2 200K, 1M 3/8 TURF 87</p> <p>11 CHANNEL MAKER 9-5 8 HIGHLAND SKY 9-2 6 ZULU ALPHA 3-1 4 HUNTER O'RILEY 10-1</p> <p><u>1st: 11 CHANNEL MAKER</u> Really a standout in this spot if he can get a decent trip from this wide post. He beat half the field in the Pegasus Turf in his last start despite getting checked late and five wide throughout. Rosario has a win and a runner-up finish in two starts he's been on him. Won at this distance, with Rosario, at SAR in the G2 Bowling Green. Solid in here.</p> <p><u>VALUE: 4 HUNTER O'RILEY</u> Deep closer was moving quickly at the end of the McKnight at 13-1 last time out. Think the pace will be better for him in here. Too slow early two back and he had little shot to close into that. His last win came at this same distance in the G2 Bowling Green in 2017. Rider having a nice meet here at GP.
