**PICK: 5 TOPPERT**

Iowa-bred started in statebred stakes for the previous connections before he was privately purchased back in September and moved to Bill Mott. Looks to have found a home sprinting. Last time in a non-graded stakes was a nose out 2<sup>nd</sup> in a strong CBY 75k stakes. Drop will help.

**VALUE: 2 FAYETTE WARRIOR**

Nice win last out at Turfway going one mile at 7-2. After he dueled on the lead, he put the field away with a nice kick in the lane. That was the first start with Serpa. He's won 4 of 8 for this trainer. Ran 3<sup>rd</sup> in a 100k stakes in his only start on dirt. Toss him in bottom of exotic wagers.

**PICK: 11 HONEST MISCHIEF**

Big pedigree. Sibling to G1 Forego winner First Defence. 2<sup>nd</sup> dam is Toussaud. Her offspring include \$2M winner, Chester House, \$2M winner Empire Maker and the dam of this one, \$900k winner, Honest Lady. Winner of debut was 1st time Pletcher runner who ran 3<sup>rd</sup> in op clm next.

**VALUE: 3 RY'S THE GUY**

Shipper from GP ran 2<sup>nd</sup> in debut and then a very sharp 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 2<sup>nd</sup> start going long. The rider lost his whip last out and that might have cost him a better placing. He is bred to handle this distance. Comes in with a strong set of works for a trainer who doesn't normally train quick.

**PICK: 1 COVFEFE**

Debut was sensational after she took serious action at the windows. Was hammered down to 3-5 last time out in the G1 Frizette. She faded in the lane. It looks better since the winner came back to win Breeders' Cup Juv Fillies. Brad Cox runners are firing. Working very strong.

**VALUE: 6 TAKE CHARGE ANGEL**

Just like the top choice, she ran off the page in the first start before a pop and stop as the favorite in stakes in her next start. Moves away from Cox to Colebrook here. Could have started at Tampa where she's been working but they're taking on tougher here. Confidence shown.

Was stopped on as a 3YO in early May. Something likely went wrong after the Peter Pan. Came back sprinting at GP. Got away a bit awkwardly and was checked early on. He was really finishing well late. Good enough to beat graded stakes winners Lone Sailor and Bravazo as 2YO.

**VALUE: 2 THE HARDEST WAY**

The talent is there but he appears to have some issues physically that have kept him from staying active. Huge win last out when he stalked the pace and drew away at GP. Unfortunately that came 13 months ago. Runner-up in that win won 7x since then including 4 stakes races.

**PICK: 4 DYNABEE**

Ran 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 12 runners two back at 1M 1/2 at Naas in Ireland. She was favored in there at 4-1 which speaks to how good that field was. Connections overseas had her in a Group 3 in her 3<sup>rd</sup> start. Trainer has been successful in last few years. Off slow in last but finished w/ a rush.

**VALUE: 9 SCREENWRITER**

Not much speed in this race so this off-the-pace runner might be closer to the pace than she is used to. Saez is aboard for the first time and that is a pretty huge move today. Third in last returned to win an allowance at TP her next start. Trainer 9 for 17 in the money here at KEE.

**PICK: 1 COPPER TOWN**

Set a fast pace in the G3 Hal's Hope last time out but he was overtaken by the red-hot Prince Lucky. That runner came back to win the G2 GP Mile by 5 for Todd Pletcher with a 100 Beyer. 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> ran 2<sup>nd</sup> in stakes next. Fired a solid work at PBD since then. Rounding into top form.

**VALUE: 5 STILL HAVING FUN**

Closer will get pace to run into as there are many speed types that need-the-lead. He's 2 for 7 at this distance of 7F. Upset winner of the G2 Woody Stephens when early pace was fast and fell apart late. Had a difficult trip last out at Laurel. Geroux up. Been working strongly for this.

**PICK: 9 BOUND FOR NOWHERE**  
 Very talented 5YO horse is 2 for 2 at this distance. Going to let the Shadwell Mile go when he beat just two home at 7-1. He drew an impossible 13 post on the softer turf course and couldn't make the lead. Traveled wide and faded late. He nearly won the G1 Jubilee at 16-1 at Ascot.

**VALUE: 11 IMPRIMIS**  
 Trip matters most in a spot like this and while the wide post isn't ideal, it's likely he won't run into traffic issues like those down on the inside. Fired in every race but 4 back when steadied on the rail at W0. Major 109 Beyer for the easy win at GP last time out. Serious win chance.

**PICK: 4 AMY'S CHALLENGE**  
 Mac Robertson has been very patient with this 4YO filly. Connections were offered \$1M for her after the win first time out by the Doug O'Neill camp and they passed. She has rewarded their patience by developing into a sprint star. One of the most impressive fillies at OP this meet.

**VALUE: 4 LATE NIGHT POW WOW**  
 Hard to knock a runner who has won 11 of 12 starts. She was beaten on the wire in her only loss, a 4.5F dash last year at CT. Love the fact that she can get in the race out of the gate but rates comfortably behind fast fractions. Gets a massive rider move. She gets a major class test.

**PICK: 6 DREAM MAKER**  
 Connections G1 turf winning sibling, Dream Dancing. He was the 7-2 second choice in the Tampa Bay Dby in last but never looked comfortable. Away slow and steadied a bit on turn. Owner had Champion 2YO Classic Empire. The win two back was very good. The runner-up won in his next start vs opt clm company. Really troubled trip in the Breeders' Futurity. Huge work since last and gets Geroux back. Trainer showing confidence off a bad run.

**2nd: 3 SIGNALMAN**  
 Ran third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at 68-1 after 2nd in the G1 Breeders' Futurity at 10-1. Finished off his 2YO campaign with a win in the G2 Kentucky Jockey Club at 7-2 odds. Doubt he was fully cranked for the comeback in the FOY. Didn't take any action at the window and ran a flat 7<sup>th</sup>. Works are much more serious since that race. Has the look of one who is arching towards a big effort.

**PICK: 6 RESTLESS RIDER**  
 She was green early in her career but showed talent as a serious G1 filly. Loved her in the BC Juv Fillies two back but she couldn't run down Jaywalk. She looks like a filly who is going to improve with age. McPeck has her really doing well in the morning. Expecting a career best here.

**VALUE: 1 BIZWHACKS**  
 Took 8 starts to break maiden and that isn't normally the profile of a G1 winner. She was a solid 3<sup>rd</sup> to a major foe, Chocolate Kisses, in the G3 Honeybee at OP in most recent start. Think she'll get a good trip saving ground on the inside here. Check getter belongs in the exotics.

**PICK: 9 HUNGRY KITTEN**  
 Dam was a multiple G2 winner on the grass as she took home over 750k 6 to 7 years ago for these connections. Debut was very good. It's not easy to win going long first time out. She was finishing well in what was likely prep work for later. Blistering works for patient type trainer.

**VALUE: 6 SHE'S GOT MOVES**  
 Trainer is 2 for 6 with 3 in the money in their 2<sup>nd</sup> start in a sprint to route MSW. One of those winners was here at Keeneland. Dam won 250k on the grass. 2001 Queen's Plate winner is in the female tree as is 3.2M winner and multiple G1 winner Dance Smartly. Expect much better.

**3rd: 2 VEKOMA**  
 He's run well but gets a slight downgrade due to sprint heavy pedigree. Dam was only a 6F type that flopped in her lone route. Did run well in chase mode in the G2 FOY last out. That was a fast pace that fell apart late and set up for closers. He is talented and deserves a long look in this spot but leaning elsewhere due sprint pedigree.

**4th: 4 MARKET KING**  
 Trainer D Wayne Lukas has won the Kentucky Derby 4x and knows his way around an expensive and talented 3YO. Only started two routes and he won one of them at 7-2 and ran 3<sup>rd</sup> in the G2 Rebel at 48-1 in the other. Might see other speed but appears to be able to relax if pace warrants it. Sharp 4F move at OP just 6 days ago. Price.
