Claimed for 15k about a year ago. Since then, these new connections have won 3 times with this Ark-bred. Only the last win, last time out, was in with statebreds. Show finisher in the last start won at the same level next as a 9-2 chance. 7YO mare is 12 for 19 in the money here at OP. Sneaky good trainer and rider. The one to beat here.

VALUE: 3 JET PACK

If you make the assumption that this filly does not care for a wet track (0 for 4 with zero in the money) then she can be excused for the fourth-place finish last out when at this level. She was only beaten 3 lengths in there, but she came into that race on a 3-race winning streak. She will sit perfectly behind the speed. She is 3 for 6 at OP.

Didn't have a great trip routing last out against better. 5th two back won in next start at md clm 50k. Post and cutback could cause him to be far back early. Obvious player but will be overbet.

VALUE: 8 VINEY

He faced better for much of his career when in the barn of a 6% trainer before the layoff from last May. His two starts for Casey Schleis have been good in this context. Was steadied in between runners entering the far turn last out. That likely cost him third place. Third start in a form cycle. Not facing a strong field. Has a win chance.

Trainer had one first timer at OP. It came in Dec in Ark MSW sprinting in MSW with this same rider up. He ran second at 8-1 with a similar worktab. These connections have the full sib who won a MSW here in her second out and then an allowance after (both with Erik Asmussen). Only 3 broke :48.4 on 2/22 at HOU so that work was legit.

VALUE: 9 SECRET SLEW

She ran three times as a 2YO in the fall / winter and did not run a bad race. The winner of the last two starts on this track were shipping in from CD where they were in with better. Adds Lasix for the first time. The 2nd dam was G1 placed in the early 1990's. She's had plenty of works to prepare her. Top call rider aboard. Late run here.

There is a major standout that comes out of a fast race and one of the also-rans from that same race chunks up for second behind the favorite. This one was third to Noble Affair two back despite very wide in the race. He exited that race and destroyed five foes in a MSW here. The winner, Honor Marie, was just third in the G3 Ky Cup at TP after crushing in a stakes there a start earlier. Handled no Lasix in there. Bill Mott charge.</p> <p>VALUE: 1 WINNEMAC AVENUE Comes into this in good form with back to back second place finishes against top level allowance runners here. The down side is those came when on Lasix which isn't in the mix today. He hasn't run without Lasix since the debut. He is 7 for 10 in the exacta at this distance so far. Was off slow two back. While he tired he was still well clear of third. Female family of 4x G1 winner Jolie's Halo (1991 Donn). Strong local works.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 NEOEQUOS The win last time out on the turf is significant. He was able to relax behind the speed and close late to win. H was third in the G2 Fountain of Youth last year with this rider (Irad Ortiz) up. He was 5-2, flashed speed but he faded quickly when beaten 8 lengths. Was 2nd in G1 in his last start as a 2YO. The winner, Ted Noffey, won the BC Juv next and was the two-year old champion. There were 5 next out winners from his maiden win. Dam and second dam were G3 turf winners. A bullet drill since the last race. Think he's primed to move forward 2nd off the layoff.</p> <p>2ND: 6 RENEGADE Pletcher won this race 5 times (last time in 2018 with Magnum Moon for same owners). Cost nearly \$1M and has run well in all 4 starts. Only loss since the debut was to a main Ky Derby favorite, Paladin, who went on to take the G2 Risen Star next for Chad Brown. Sam Davis was flattered when The Puma won the Tampa Bay Derby next. Has the 1995 G1 Whitney winner, Unaccounted For, in the female line. All the speed in here sets him up.</p> <p>3RD: 2 SILENT TACTIC Mark Casse has been automatic at this meet. This one is 5 for 5 in the top two so far in his career and was very good in all 3 local starts as he followed the sequence of races leading to this G1. Just like Renegade, this one is going to get all kinds of pace to set up his late kick. He was unlucky to lose the Rebel when outnodded by one for Todd Pletcher. He was, however, more than 5 clear of the rest. Form is excellent. Really no excuses in here.</p> <p>4TH: 9 LITMUS TEST Bob Baffert is a 5-time winner of this race. It includes his Triple Crown winner, American Pharoah as well as the 2012 Ky Derby runner-up, Bodemeister. Blinkers are off for the first time which will dull his speed. That will be ideal as he stands a better chance rating. It will take all of the skills from Arrieta to get him into a good spot early from the outside post. The winner of that one came back to win an allw at FG by six with 96 Beyer. 5th beaten 6 returned to win an allw at OP next (Gethsemane) beating the 2,3,4,10 and 11 in here. 7th and 8th place from last out won MSW at FG next.</p> <p>VALUE: 7 SILVER SHOT Was behind the top choice in both FG races but wasn't beaten too badly in either. They paid \$2.2M for this one at the 2024 KEE Sep sale. Dam was G1 placed on grass. Has a G2 winning sib who was third in the G1 Ashland last year. 2nd dam was third in the 2008 Ky Oaks and won a few G1's on turf. Irad up. This trainer is 5 for 12 (42%) with a Euro shipper off a similar layoff on the turf in a non-claiming event. He is 2 for 3 (the loss was a 2nd place finish) that filter with Gaffalione riding. Winner 3 back won a G1 after in Europe. Walsh has had 3 months to prepare her for this.</p> <p>VALUE: 3 VEKOMA VIEW She has just one sib and that one is 4 for 5 in the top 2 on the grass. That includes a runner-up finish in the G1 American Oaks just after Christmas at SA. She beat 1st timers for Brendan Walsh and Brad Cox in the win last out. Probably won't have such an easy time of it early in this spot. Good to see Zayas remain. That includes an easy win over a good field last out in the GP Sprint. He should get a pretty good pace to set him up. He can press the pace as he did in the last two with this rider of come from far back. He's 3 for 4 here at GP. He overcame a stumbled start two back. Form is very good.</p> <p>VALUE: 5 BACK EM UP Not sure what happened in his last start when beaten 22 lengths. The race prior might be enough to win this. He was second to superstar Mott runner Knightsbridge and in front of some very good runners. The show finisher ran 3rd in the New Orleans next. Note the 3 works since the last start. His trainer is 2-time Ky Derby winner Bill Mott. He easily dispatched one of the rivals in here, The Puma, first time out and did so in hand late in an impressive debut. Was giving the winner of the G2 Risen Star (also in this race) an edge since that one was already a stakes and route winner. Mott second in this race last year with Sovereignty. Mott normally patient with this kind. This 3rd start will show big improvement.</p> <p>2ND: 4 COMMANDMENT Brad Cox Grade 2 Fountain of Youth winner (over the top choice). He was the favorite in there and won gamely in the end. Consider there were 5 other dirt races on that day. Every other winner was wide in the stretch. This is the only one who won on the rail. He is a 500k purchase. Dam was a Grade 1 winner. Brad Cox is 26 for 75 (35%) when off at under 4-1 in a dirt graded stakes for 3YO's routing. He won this race G1 last year with Tappan Street.</p> <p>3RD: 6 NEARLY Todd Pletcher has won this race 7 times. He won it 3 of the last 5 years with Fierceness (2024), Forte (2023) and Known Agenda (2021). This colt looks very similar to his 2018 winner Audible. Both lost in debut sprinting in NY and then won easily 2nd time out. Both won the Holy Bull by 5 lengths. They both had the same Palm Beach drills. Has Mineshaft on the bottom and Giant's Causeway on the top of the pedigree. That screams longer distances.</p> <p>4TH: 8 THE PUMA These are the same connections that had the runner-up in this race in 2023, Mage. That colt went on to win the Kentucky Derby in his next start. A bit awkward start in the debut, and Castellano might have sent him earlier than he needed when run down by the top choice. He's improving start over start. The one he beat in the Tampa Bay Derby is a Brad Cox who had won the G2 Ky Jockey Club prior. He'll close into a fast pace. Did not have the best trip in the win last out. The runner-up, a G3 winner, had a big jump on her into the stretch but this one was much the best. Joseph won this race last year with a similar opt clm winner previous out. Saffie 24% with 2nd off similar layoffs with a last out winner.</p> <p>VALUE: 6 SILVER MOONLIGHT This is the other runner for Saffie Joseph. She comes in off a strong third (beaten just a length) in the G3 Honey Cox here at 1M. She was helped a bit by sitting up on a slow early pace. The winner is a millionaire, serious turf filly. Husbands opted off of the top choice to land here as first call rider for Saffie.
