Been decent for Robert Medina. He does have excuses in his 6 losses for him. Stumbled four back at 8-1 at Keeneland. 11 post 3 back at CD in a strong MSW. Winner of last ran 2nd in an opt clm next. 3rd won a MSW here next out. 8th, 9th ran 2nd in mdn clm 30k next both at 5-1. Has 5 works. Massive rider move to Castellano.

Value: 3 Tiz Wicked Strong

4YO gelding was unlucky to lose in the most recent start. He was surging late and got into a photo but lost the headbob. He's now 2 for 2 in the exacta on this synthetic track. In a key race 3 back. Winner won opt clm next at Tampa. 2nd won MSW at OP. 3rd won mdn clm 125k. 4th won a Parx MSW by 21-lengths two weeks ago.

Dam a half sibling to the \$5M earner Nyquist (5x Grade 1 winner, won the 2016 Ky Derby). Trainer is 5 for 8 (63%) with 7 in the top 3 finishers (88%) and a \$4.34 ROI with a debut runner sprinting in a MSW. All of those came at Woodbine. Works for this one are similar to the 5 winners. Rider Corrales is 2 for 4 riding for Carroll.

Value: 11 Life's Saga

Irish breeding leads back to Sagamix. He was the 1998 winner of the prestigious Group 1 Arc d'Triomphe. Trainer is 5 for 11 (45%) with 7 in the money (64%) and a tremendous \$11.00 ROI with a debut 3YO+ sprinting in MSW. That includes his last such starter which was here at 12-1. Might be better with distance. Check tote.

There is pedigree here. Second dam (Fun House) produced the \$3.9M earner Untapable (won the 2014 Ky Oaks and BC Distaff) and \$1.7M earner Paddy O'Prado (3rd in the 2010 Ky Derby). The trainer (Steve Asmussen) is about average with comebacker of this type, 17%. Doubt we've seen his best but in a very tough race.

Vacillating between inside and outside post draws. Might have been forced into early duty from the 11 post in last and stalking a very slow early pace. He did beat more than half of that field at 25-1 so it was a decent effort. Will be able to save ground nearer the pace today. Rider got to know him in last start. Will be a price.

Runner-up in the second start crushed in a 100k stakes here and a serious 3YO prospect. Obviously overdue after the last two photo losses. Dettori gets up.

Value: 2 Term

Trainer Thomas Drury is 8 for 17 (47%) w/ 13 in the money (76%) with a debut 3YO or older sprinting in a MSW and off at 5-1 odds or less. Female family is loaded with stakes winners like the 2nd dam Yell (600k) and Roar (500k). Praise is in the female line and she is dam of \$2M earner Congrats. Check for any betting action.

Hard to look past the way he won the Dust Commander last time out. He came from off the pace and just crushed that field with a career best 102 Beyer. It appears he’s going to get enough pace to set him up for a run again. He can sit closer to the pace as he did 2 back. 2 for 4 here at TP. Saves ground from the inside draw.

Value: 8 Atone

Last win came in the Grade 1 Pegasus in 2023. He’s lost 8 races in a row but does have some excuses. Was steadied a bit early in the last start and ended up with a very wide trip. Saved ground in the Pegasus two back and was stuck behind horses before a late surge. Looking to regain prior form for cold trainer Michael Maker.

Trainer Kenneth McPeck is 6 for 17 (35%) with 10 of the 17 in the money (59%) and a \$3.89 ROI when he has a second time starter in a stakes race off a maiden win in the debut. She was in hand all the way to the wire and really geared down in that win. Dam is a full sib to \$3.6M earner Exaggerator (2nd in the ‘16 G1 Ky Derby).

Value: 8 Pink Polkadots

Can be any kind after two dominant wire to wire wins. The :47.3 quarter in the debut was two seconds faster than the other grass route that day. Same scenario in the 2nd start. The other 3 routes on turf were 50.3, 49.3 and 50 flat. 2nd dam won 300k and her sib Riskaverse was a 3x G1 winner of \$2.2M on turf twenty years ago.

Winner of 3 of his last 6 starts. Blinkers were removed 3 back and it produced two wins and a good 4th in the G2 Rebel at 44-1. He was not helped from the post draw in 3 of the last 4. Drew widest in full fields in the last two and the rail 4 back forcing him into an early speed situation. Rider Machado was aboard in the local win.

Value: 6 Northern Flame

Beat the top choice when 3rd in the Rebel and was about a length in front of that one. 425k purchase has run well since the MSW win. Close 4th in a G1 at 49-1 after that win. Sloppy track wasn’t to his liking in the G3. Stumbled break but closed strongly in the opt clm 3 back. All the family is turf or synthetic. Worth a glance.

She was 4th in a key race in the debut. The top 3 finishers out of that race won right back in opt clm at TP (84 Beyer), MSW at GP (80 Beyer) and MSW at TP (70 Beyer). 10th won back in a MSW at MVR (67 Beyer). 7th was 3rd in a tough MSW at OP next. She found some traffic on the turn in last but finished very well late in there.

Value: 5 Starlight Love

Dam was a Group 3 winner overseas and a stakes winner here in the US. All 3 sibs that ran were for this same owner. One of those won in debut (by 7) and the other two were next a neck in their 1st start. Lobo trained all 3. The two second place finishers were on the turf at huge odds. Lobo typically works them very slowly.
