### PICK: 6 LA CANTERA

She was claimed for the second time in her career by these connections three back. She turned out to be a nice claim as she was second and then won over this turf last out as the 7-5 favorite. On the board in 11 of 13 in her career and 7 of 9 on the turf. Can set the pace (Gaffalione rode her in a wire to wire maiden win) or sit just behind. In good form.

### VALUE: 8 BEING BETTY

She stretches out after running sprints in 3 of 4 since she came back from the 2024 campaign. Her lone route was 2 back when she was 51-1 in a stakes at SAR. She didn't have Lasix there (does today). Exits a key race. 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> won opt clm (SA) and allw (FG) next. Runner-up was beaten just neck in allw (TP). 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> also ran 2<sup>nd</sup> next time out.

### PICK: 2 SWING VOTE

She was sent off as the 8-5 favorite in the debut. That was a tough trip as she was slow from the gate from the inside post, steadied off of heels on the turn and then flattened out late in a better-than-it-looks effort. Comes back today with first time Lasix. Has a sib who won his second career start in MSW at ELP with an 88 Beyer. Needs a better break.

### VALUE: 4 AFFLUENZA

Trainer David Fawkes has had a great meet. He's won 27% of his starts. His last 7 starters have yielded 3 wins and 2 runner-up finishes. He's 14% with MSW dirt sprinters in a debut. Sire fee is just 10k but he sold as a yearling for 160k at the Keeneland September Sale. Dam won a G3 here on dirt in the 2017 Sugar Swirl. Has solid drills and Jose Ortiz.

### PICK: 3 RISK TOLERANCE

Chad Brown is 6 for 13 (46%) with 10 in the exacta (77%) with a last out turf route winner at Tampa Bay in opt clm or allowance. This is a royally bred 5YO horse with deep turf roots on both sides of the family tree. Brown is 35 for 126 (28%) with 74 in the money (59%) in turf routes with Prat up for this ownership (Klaravich). Has a lot of upside.

### VALUE: 2 BATTLE OF NORMANDY

He's a G3 winner and has won 5 of 14 career starts. He gets into this race since he hasn't won a race since last March or before. He's been off a year. Trainer Shug McGaughey is excellent with comebacks like this. Been on Lasix 5 times on the turf. He won 3 of them and was second in the other two. He's run well fresh a few times. Perfect work spacing.

<b>PICK: 11 AWESOME CZECH</b>  NY-bred is on the also-eligible list for the G2 Pegasus F&M Turf today. If she doesn't make it into the body of the field then this is where she will go. She hasn't run on this kind of surface yet but is 12 for 16 in the money on the turf. The grass is usually a good gauge for how they'll run on synth. Has 3 wins and 2 in the money from 5 starts with blinkers.		<b>PICK: 5 FIONN</b>  She faced the best of her generation as a 3YO on the grass last year. She certainly held her own. She is 6 for 6 on firm turf in her career. She won both times she was coming off a significant layoff. Only loss in the last 4 starts (Prat up in all 4) was in the G1 QEII. Blinkers off in last and she closed well to win. The one to beat if ready after a 2 month break.		<b>PICK: 6 HORSEPOWER</b>  He's 4 for 5 in the exacta on synthetic. One of the two wins on this surface came here when he won an opt clm at 7-1 odds. Winner of the last start at TP is a Brad Cox who has won over 800k. The show finisher was beaten less than 2 in a 100k on the turf at FG next at 5-1 (91 Beyer). He should be tracking near the front in an ideal spot with Jose Ortiz.	
<b>VALUE: 8 DANCING N DIXIE</b>  She won her 3 <sup>rd</sup> and 4 <sup>th</sup> career start right here on this type of surface (MSW and 90k stakes). There could be pace for her to close into here. She didn't get that in either of the G3 races at WO. She ran evenly in the last start but think she was too close to the pace in there. She'll be far behind in this one and look for one run in the lane. Zayas is back.  A) 3,6,8,11    B) 4,9,10    C) 1,2    D) 5,7,13		<b>VALUE: 6 RAMSEY POND</b>  She was runner-up to Lush Lips 7 starts ago on this grass course. That one has since won 3 stakes including the G1 QEII over the top choice. Bumped at the start last time out and had a lot of ground to make up late. She had to go out 8 wide for a run and just ran out of time. Back to Irad Ortiz who was aboard her in a runner-up placing three back at KD. Earned a 95 fig 3 back in his only start on synthetic (which came here). The winner of that race won an allowance at KEE next and has run in a G1 and G2 since then. <b>PICK: 10 MY BOY PRINCE</b>  The last 10 times Mark Casse has gone route to sprint on the turf with a layoff of this kind (or longer), he's won 7 of them (70%). 9 of the 10 hit the board. This one took a 150k stakes at 6F off the layoff last year at Aqueduct. He ran in 4 Grade 1's and 1 Grade 2 after that. Almost pulled off the 10-1 upset in the WO Mile two back. Certainly has the class.		<b>PICK: 6 KNIGHTSBRIDGE</b>  Expert ride at 1-5 in the G3 Mr Prospector last time out. He was allowed to go 45.4 early and always looked a winner saving ground the whole way. Crushed in his first 2 starts and looked like a future superstar. Had some starts and stops but is finely tuned now. Sib to the Grade 1 winner Speaker's Corner. Second dam won the 2006 G1 BC Distaff.		<b>PICK: 1 ZVEREV</b>  Michael Maker is a master at claiming for higher prices and moving those runners into stakes rather quickly. He took this one for 40k in the start 3 back and he won all 3 since then including a stakes at 7-1 at TP. 7 <sup>th</sup> from there (beaten 10) won an opt clm at TP (84 Beyer). Dam was a 3-time G1 winner and her sibling is the superstar \$7M earner Zenyatta.	
<b>VALUE: 4 AND UWISH</b>  He's been first or second in 7 of 8 sprints (both on turf and synthetic). Thought he ran a big race from the wide post in the Janus last time out. The winner was 4 <sup>th</sup> in the G1 BC Turf Sprint in the previous start and has now won 4 of last 5 starts (a G2 and a G3 in that span). Perfect post given his tracking running style. This start in a form cycle in this one.  A) 1,4,8,10    B) 3,11,12    C) 6,7,8    D) 4,9		<b>VALUE: 5 TOUR PLAYER</b>  Sold from Bob and Natalie Baffert for 350k at the Dec FTD Sale. This will be the first start for the new connections. Is coming in with 4 wins in 5 starts that spanned 13 months with the Baffert crew. Show finisher in the last start went to OP and won the restricted 135k The Coach (96 Beyer) at 1M 1/16. Gets a class test but clearly has talent and upside.  A) 1,6    B) 5    C) 2,7,9    D) 3,4,8		<b>VALUE: 2 ACT A FOOL</b>  A very strong angle here. This is the only speed in the race. But moreover, it's significantly cheap speed (meaning he's not as classy as the others) which means no one will try to keep him honest early. They will assume he'll fade out as the real running begins. Often times this kind can be a lot braver than expected. Will have a target on him in the lane. <p><b>10 – GULFSTREAM PARK (3:45 ET)</b> PEGASUS F&amp;M TURF (G2) 500K, 1M 1/16 TURF</p> <p>10 AND ONE MORE TIME 12-1 1 READY FOR SHIRL 20-1 4 BREATH AWAY 8-1 8 PROCTOR STREET 12-1</p> <p><b>PICK: 10 AND ONE MORE TIME</b> He had the blinkers on in the last two starts and it might have made him too eager early. He was up on the lead last out in a fast :47.1 for a route in MSW. Goes back to Eurton, removes blinkers, cuts back in distance and drops into this soft maiden claiming race. Off slow in the first two but did have some run late. Eurton 3 for last 4 MSW to md claiming.</p> <p><b>VALUE: 1 READY FOR SHIRL</b> Trainer has had just two starters in mdn claiming 50k for Cal-breds on the dirt for 3YO's and older in the last 3 years. He won both of those (odds of 3-1 and 7-2). Both of those wins were in Feb 2025. The works were similar to that of this one. Bred to sprint with speedball Cal-bred Smokem on the top of the pedigree. He needs a good gate dispatch.</p> <p>A) 1,2,4,8,10    B) 3,5,7    C) 6,9,11,12    D)</p>	<p>20</p> <p><b>11 – GULFSTREAM PARK (4:18 ET)</b> INSIDE INFORMATION (G2) 225K, 7F DIRT</p> <p>8 STERLING SILVER 8-1 3 JODY'S PRIDE 4-1 10 ONE MAGIC FILLY 10-1 12 VERITY 12-1</p> <p><b>PICK: 8 STERLING SILVER</b> Hard not to like this NY-bred. She sold for 13k in 2020 and is now a \$1.3M earner. She is 21 of 27 in the money on fast dirt for just short of a million dollars. Castellano is 7 for 16 aboard her. She comes in off a nice prep win and carries just 120 pounds, the lowest since 2024 for her. Can press the pace or come from behind. Very honest, talented mare.</p> <p><b>VALUE: 10 ONE MAGIC FILLY</b> Comes out of the same stakes that was won by the choice here the day after Christmas. That wasn't her best effort. She was the 7-5 favorite but tired in the lane. The Grade 3 runner-up two back could win this race. The winner is just a neck from being 4 for 4 (3 wins by daylight). He was on the inside for the entire race and was blocked and steadied for most of the stretch. Makes just his 4<sup>th</sup> start in a year and a half but has run well off the bench. He's a two-time Grade 1 winner on the grass. Chad Brown is 5 for 14 (36%) off a layoff like this into a graded stakes on the turf beyond 1M here at GP.</p> <p><b>VALUE: 12 FORT WASHINGTON</b> Second year in a row that this one has drawn the 12 post in this race. He closed well last year to finish 5<sup>th</sup> beaten just over two lengths at 40-1. Won 3 of 5 starts since then and that includes the G1 Arlington Million at CNL two back. <p><b>13 – GULFSTREAM PARK (5:39 ET)</b> PEGASUS WORLD CUP (G1) \$3M, 1M 1/8 DIRT</p> <p>4 BANISHING 20-1 1 DISCO TIME 8-5 7 TAPPAN STREET 6-1 11 WHITE ABARRO 4-1</p> <p><b>PICK: 4 BANISHING</b> Most of this field is forwardly placed. It will come down to who is able to relax and save something for late. This one came from off the pace to win the G2 CT Classic 4 back at 5-2 odds. Trainer David Jacobson has not decided if he is a sprinter or router. Lost to a legit sprinter in the stakes at OP last out. Toss the G1 BC Sprint as he had much trouble.</p> <p><b>VALUE: 7 TAPPAN STREET</b> Million dollar purchase in 2023 looked like a bargain when he beat superstar Sovereign in the Florida Derby. He hit the bench afterwards before finally returning in an op clm here as a prep for this. Could absolutely get the run of the race behind a very fast pace.
