Drew the wide 11 post in her last start and passed a few runners late but never challenged in a higher level. That was a key race, 6 next out winners from there.</p> <p>VALUE: 8 THAT'STHEWAYTODOIT Tony Rengstorf mare has good speed. She was on a loose lead two back and was game when finishing second at 13-1. On the lead again in last but might not have wanted the good turf. Another who takes a major class drop. Retains Quinonez for this start. She didn't run well in most recent start going a mile but was second in MSW in a race she was very wide two back. This is a major class drop. Should save ground from the rail today.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 CHARMING FURY Been in the money in three straight dirt starts (can toss the turf start from the 12 post three back). 3rd in last some 7 behind Give Em Shade but she did a lot of the heavy lifting pressing the pace early. The Rhone runners normally improve with some starts. Off slow vs. tougher 2 back.</p> <p>VALUE: 5 TEDDY TIME Really thought he was sitting on a big race last out after a strong finish two back. But he ran a bad last at 17-1 beaten nearly 30 lengths. Was claimed in last by a trainer who is 4 for 16 (25%) first off the claim (9 on the board, 56%).</p> <p>VALUE: 6 GOT EVEN SMARTER Two very good starts in a row for this Mn-bred. That coincides with a move to a high percentage trainer (Silva). Got into trouble in last but split runners and got up to win going away. Late runner hit the board in 7 of 9 at the distance. Should be finishing quickly. Trainer is 30% with last out winners.</p> <p>VALUE: 3 SIDE STREET DAVE Hasn't been on the turf since last year. This 4YO is 3 for 5 in the money on the grass. He ran 2nd twice at higher levels with trainer Shawn Davis. Unlucky to lose 3 back at 16-1 when he ran a winning race when 2nd. Toss last race. That was on a muddy track. Was off awkwardly in last and never got into the race there.</p> <p>VALUE: 9 ARNOLD'S PATSY Ran second four back at 10-1 for Rhone and jockey Dean Butler. Faced better three back and then was on the turf two back. She was sent hard in that turf race and faded. Last was a bit better than it looks as pace was fast and she was hung out wide there. Mn-bred clearly likes the turf. That is surprising as he has Cozzene pedigree (strong turf influence) on the female side. Might have been best two back in the runner-up to Thick Haze. He was in traffic prior to closing well. Same trip in last. Does like this turf.

VALUE: 9 STAR MISSION

Bred for the turf. He was moved back to turf in last but was in a very tough allowance field. Drops here to what looks to be the right level. Faced tougher while in Kentucky at KEE, CD and TP. He might be a bit overlooked. Drop in class makes him an option.

PICK: 1 TAPAGE

Last two starts came on the turf but this gelding has never hit the board in 7 turf tries. Obviously it looks like he needs to be on dirt. Ran twice on this dirt in the starts 2, 3 back. Those were in tough fields. The winner 3 back won the 50k Wallys Choice at 9-1 odds.

VALUE: 7 A ROSE FOR RAVEN

This runner was purchased to run on the turf. Dam was a strong turf runner in her day. This gelding is 2 for 4 on the turf but he did run well in his start on the dirt three back when second from the widest 9 post. Trainer having a good meet. In good form now.

PICK: 3 KARALINKA

Thought she was really sitting on a big race in most recent start. But she didn't get a great ride. Was out very wide on the turn and lost a lot of momentum in there. Toss the sloppy track start two back. She gets a rider move to Eikleberry (2nd in jockey standings).

VALUE: 7 GOLDEN EYED QUEEN

Anything with Touch Gold in the pedigree should be able to handle the turf. She was on the turf twice in sprints like this. She went very fast three back but faded late. Blinkers on two back and she had some run but steadied. Should compete for a spot today.
