CODEX broke in stride, stalked the early pace while relaxed nicely, joined for command three-wide entering the second turn and quickly drew clear. Cordero looked back entering the stretch, angled extremely wide intimidating and lightly brushing GENIUNE RISK in the early stretch and CODEX gradually drew away while ridden out to the wire. An objection lodged against CODEX by the rider of GENUINE RISK for interference entering the stretch was disallowed. GENUINE RISK eased back and dropped to the inside early, broke stride after angling to the outside leaving the backstretch. She quickly joined CODEX from the outside entering the stretch, lost momentum when carried extremely wide and lightly brushed into the stretch and gradually weakened thereafter. COLONEL MORAN moved to challenge at the half but could not keep pace inside the top pair in the drive. JAKLIN KLUGMAN made a bid into the stretch and weakened. BING bested tired rivals. SAMOYED was outrun. KNIGHT LANDING and LUCKY PLUCK tired.
