SUMMER BIRD was strung out four wide on the first turn, settled in good position just off the pace from outside along the backstretch, launched a rally leaving the far turn, rapidly closed the gap three wide to open a clear advantage nearing the quarter pole, extended his lead in midstretch and edged away under strong handling. HOLD ME BACK was taken in hand soon after the start, trailed along the backstretch, moved out midway on the turn, circled six wide approaching the quarter pole then closed strongly in the middle of the track to clearly best the others. QUALITY ROAD tucked in along the rail in the early stages, raced in the middle of the pack along the backstretch, saved ground while gaining a bit on the turn, split rivals at the quarter pole, made a run to reach contention in midstretch then weakened under pressure in the final eighth. CHARITABLE MAN moved out on the first turn, swung four wide entering the backstretch, raced well back for seven furlongs, advanced three wide between horses leaving the quarter pole and lacked a strong closing response. WARRIOR'S REWARD was rated three wide for a half, lodged a move from outside on the far turn, made a strong five wide bid to threaten nearing the quarter pole and flattened out. KENSEI pressed the pace from outside along the backstretch, took the lead at the half mile pole, continued on the front to the turn and gave way in upper stretch. OUR EDGE set the pace inside for five furlongs, gave way on the turn and was eased in the stretch.
