Early Times, Louisville Breeders' Cup on Oaks Card

CHURCHILL DOWNS, Louisville, Ky.—Jugen Stable's Yankee Affair, second as the favorite in the fourth running of the Elkhorn Stakes at a mile and an eighth, and Alejandro Menditeguy's Equalize, two and a quarter lengths winner in his last start at Hialeah on March 25, should vie for the favorite's role here on Friday when they head a field of nine grass specialists in the third running of the Grade III & \$176,600 Early Times Turf Classic for turf runners going a mile and an eighth.

through the drive and flattened out the final furlong of the Grade III mile and an eighth Elkhorn Stakes on April 27.

However, before the Elkhorn, Yankee Affair rallied smartly in the drive to get up by a nose at the conclusion of the mile and a sixteenth Fort Harrod Stakes on turf at Keeneland on April 13. Yankee Affair was seventh early, moved with a rush to be second in upper stretch, then finished determinedly to best Jalaajel. Yankee Affair will break from post number five under 116 pounds and Randy Romero will ride.

The Early times is one of three stakes offered here on Kentucky Oaks Day. If all start in this test, the winner will earn \$114,790.

Set to face the top two are Ray Foncari and Nancy Vanier's iron Courage, 116 the weight, Earlie Fires up; Alex G. Campbell Jr.'s Pertsemidid, 112, no rider named at time of entry by trainer Rusty Arnold; Harry T. Rosenblum's Royal rock, 112, Pat Day; Mike Penhale's Gallant mel, 112, Gene St. leon; Oxford Stable's Reputed Dancer, 112, no rider named;

Equalize, a winner of 12 races in 40 starts, was second in the Appleton Handicap on turf at Gulfstream in January, outfinishing Sunshine Forever, then won the Gulfstream Budweiser Breeders' Cup and Grade II Canadian Turf Handicap at Gulfstream, both on grass. The 7-year-old Equalize (by Northern Jove) will take some beating with his strong stretch-running ability and will spot his rivals from two to six pounds.

Equalize will pick up top weight of 118 pounds for the race, and Jose Santos will have the mount. Equalize breaks from post number seven.

Yankee Affair, conditioned by Henry Carroll, will be making a title defense, as he captured the Early Times a year ago. The bay gelding by Northern Fling, was three lengths short of Exclusive Partner on the Keeneland grass in his last race. Yankee Affair had aim

Also on the Oaks Day card is the fourth running of the \$155,500 Louisville Budweiser Breeders' Cup for fillies and mares at a mile and sixteenth on the main track. A field of eight including two stable couplings has been assembled and all are B.C.-eligibles. If all start, the victress will take out \$101,075 in purse money.

Expected to rate a strong share of fan support is Taylor Asbury's Darien Miss. The dark bay 4-year-old daughter of Mr. Leader last raced on April 2 at Turfway Park when she posted a comfortable two length win going a mile and a sixteenth in the Fairway Fun

Stakes while in hand much of the way.

Darien Miss will break from post number four as part of the Arnold-trained duo and Pat Johnson will ride at 115. Also going postward from the Arnold stable is Ashbrook Farm's Scorned Lass, 114, no rider named.

The other coupling comes from the barn of trainer Sam T. Ramer. They are Parrish Hill Farm's Lawyer Talk, 111, Mike McDowell up; and Landon Knight's Tougaloo, 112, Pat Day.

Also set to vie in this competitive lineup are: Allen Pulson's Savannah's Honor, 119, Jerry Bailey; George J. Aubin's (lessee) Integra, 116, no rider named; Haver Hill Farm's Miss Barbour, 108, no rider listed; John Oxley and Donna C. Ward's Way It Should Be, 110, no rider named.

Anita Oaks going a mile and a sixteenth. If speed is holding, and no one goes with Imaginary Lady, the Kentucky-bred miss should be difficult to run down.

Blondeinamol was narrowly beaten by Gorgeous in the Grade I Ashland Stakes at Keeneland on April 22. Blondeinamol went off at more than 58-1 and moved with the winner in the second turn but lost by a neck. She has good tactical speed and should be close enough throughout to make her rally effective.

Blondeinamol, trained by Phil Hauswald,

also has improved since her last race. The chestnut daughter of Bates Motel (bred in Canada) merits a shot under Pat Day and his patient style in the irons.

She's Scrumptious will be making the switch from turf to the dirt as will Key Flyer. Those two met on April 20 at Keeneland in the mile and an eighth Palisades Stakes on the turf. Key Flyer won by a half-length that day and She's Scrumptious ran third. However, both have won on dirt this year, She's Scrumptious taking the mile and a sixteenth Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay Downs and Key Flyer taking a maiden race at Gulfstream by nine lengths.
