SPECTACULAR BID ducked in slightly leaving the gate and was settled well off the pace, moved slightly outside in the initial bend to stay clear, rallied strongly after five-eighths staying well wide to be clear, ranged up outside of GENERAL ASSEMBLY with FLYING PASTER inside of him entering the last turn and was bumped by FLYING PASTER when that one was forced outside by GENERAL ASSEMBLY. He responded when roused right-handed leaving the last turn, moved clear nearing the eighth pole, but was roused steadily five times right-handed to draw out. GENERAL ASSEMBLY broke sharply and ducked in, was straightened to sprint up on the pace between rivals entering the first bend, shook off SHAMGO and continued gamely when joined by SPECTACULAR BID and FLYING PASTER. He drifted out slightly entering the last turn, summoned up an extra effort when moving into the stretch and grad-ually gave way in a game effort, GOLDEN ACT brushed by GREAT REDEEM-ER leaving the gate, settled far back, stayed inside to commence his bid after a mile and finished with good courage while not a serious threat to the first two. KING CELEBRITY, taken in hand to settle in good position, moved boldly to the pace inside, but was blocked with a half-mile left, got clear between rivals entering the stretch and hung. FLYING PASTER broke sharply and was slightly wide in the first turn, rallied inside SPECTACULAR BID and was floated out by GENERAL ASSEMBLY entering the last turn, bumped with SPECTACULAR BID three to four times, steadied into the stretch and weakened. SCREEN KING pinched at the start and checked to fall far back, moved widest to launch his bid after six furlongs and had nothing left. SIR IVOR AGAIN, slightly wide, could only pass tiring rivals. SHAMGO broke sharply ducking out, sprinted to the pace inside, maintained a slight advantage for three-quarters of a mile and tired. LOT O' GOLD, wide in the first turn, stayed in striking position for a half, then retired. GREAT REDEEMER ducked in to brush with GOLDEN ACT leaving the gate, was forwardly placed inside and stopped badly.
