<p>1 – KEENELAND (1:00 ET) 76 MAIDEN SPECIAL 90K, 4.5F DIRT</p> <p>8 PINKY FINGER 7-5 3 MONSTER 4-1 12 FLAMING STAR 30-1 10 RED SPEEDO 8-1</p> <p>PICK: 8 PINKY FINGER The numbers for Wesley Ward in spots like this are really off the charts. He is 19 for 41 (46%) with 31 in the money (76%) and a positive \$2.20 ROI with a debut 2YO on the dirt sprinting at KEE in MSW. He is 6 for 10 with such with Joel Rosario up. Sire gets 13% with debut 2YO's and 19% in dirt sprints overall. Works typical for a live Ward 1ster.</p> <p>VALUE: 12 FLAMING STAR Low percentage trainer has just 6 wins in 94 starts. But is 2 for 2 in the money with a debut 2YO at KEE sprinting on dirt in MSW for this ownership. They were 5 days apart in April 2023. One was 3rd at 39-1 and the other was 2nd at 26-1. Both had been working at Three Diamonds Racing Center in Lexington as this one has. None of these have shown anything on the dirt (or even run on it). This one has the best dirt pedigree in the race. Dam won over 200k on the dirt. 2nd dam on the female side won two graded stakes on the dirt (the 2nd of which came on a muddy track) for D Wayne Lukas in 2004.</p> <p>VALUE: 11 HEREFORAGOODTIME She has been on every surface in her 5 starts. She's tried fast dirt, muddy dirt, synthetic and turf. Dam is a sibling to Justwhistledixie(multiple graded stakes winner on dirt) but more known as the dam to New Year's Day (winner of the 2013 BC Juvenile), Mohaymen (winner of 4 Grade 2's on dirt) and G1 dirt winner Enforceable. 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<p>5 – KEENELAND (3:08 ET) 62 MAIDEN SPECIAL 110K, 6F DIRT</p> <p>11 UNWAVERING TRUST 5-2 3 IVORY AND EBONY 10-1 9 KAPOOR 7-2 8 FORBIDDEN FRIEND 20-1</p> <p>PICK: 11 UNWAVERING TRUST Big run in debut. The winner was a 6-5 favorite for Cherie DeVaux who went wire to wire. That one came back to run 2nd in the G2 FG Oaks on 3/22 at 6-1. Notice it was nearly 10 back to third. 2nd dam was G1 placed multiple times behind Sharp Cat in late '90's. Brad Cox 47% in 2nd start after in the money in debut now in sprint MSW under 3-1.</p> <p>VALUE: 3 IVORY AND EBONY Sire won the G1 BC Dirt Mile in 2019 and was 2nd after in the G1 Cigar Mile. This one looks like she might have bled in the debut. She was under 10-1 at Saratoga and broke well getting into a pace pressing position. She faded after the early exertions. She comes back with Lasix and a very strong worktab. One that attracted Irad Ortiz to ride today.</p> <p>A) 11 B) 3,8,9 C) 1,2,4,5,10,12 D)</p>	<p>6 – KEENELAND (3:40 ET) 56 ALLOWANCE 130K, 1M *OFF TURF*</p> <p>10 TOUGH LITTLE NUT 12-1 2 GEORGIE W 8-1 4 WICO 8-1 8 THIS IS USCAR 20-1</p> <p>PICK: 10 TOUGH LITTLE NUT He's got turf in the female family but the one time he had to run on dirt (2 back) he was a strong runner-up beating 8 foes, in the 100k Woodchopper. The winner ran here on Sunday and was 3rd in a 150k allowance (that was more like a stakes race). Had 3 decent works on the FG dirt into this. Hard to know how he'll handle this dirt track though.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 GEORGIE W He has a win on the main track. He won an allowance in the second start, at Indiana, by over 9-lengths vs. 3 other foes. Faded a bit at long odds in the Indiana Derby in the start afterwards. Many of the runners in the female family did some good things on dirt and on an off-track. The winner won a G3 two starts later by 3-lengths. 3rd and 5th won next out. 6th by 12 won 3 times since including the 125k Winkfield here. Crushed in most recent start. Runner-up won back by 7 earning the same 92 Beyer. Race prior and after had 6F times around 1:14 so that time was legit. He cost 240k despite little pedigree.</p> <p>VALUE: 3 SMOKEN WICKED Appears to want to spring. Given the Speightstown blood on the sire side that seems to make sense. Rattled off 3 in a row (two vs. overmatched La-breds) before he stopped in the G2 Rebel. Sharp win at CD facing opt clm 100k foes four starts ago. Has 4 strong workouts since the last race. <p>8 – KEENELAND (4:44 ET) 30 TRANSYLVANIA (G3) 600K, 1M 1/16 TURF</p> <p>2 REAGAN'S WIT 4-1 7 TEST SCORE 8-1 8 SCIPIO 6-1 4 MAUI STRONG 8-1</p> <p>PICK: 2 REAGAN'S WIT You don't see many win a MSW at FG by 8 lengths on the grass. This one did that two starts ago despite having to go 7-wide. 8 of the 9 to have run back from that race hit the board (2 winners). Lost to a Chad Brown runner last time out. That one is 4 for 5 now having won G2 Pilgrim at AQU and G3 With Anticipation at SAR. Will get a great trip.</p> <p>VALUE: 7 TEST SCORE Very consistent colt for a top level trainer. Was unlucky to lose two back. He drew the 11 post in that 14 horse field and ended up having a lot of traffic and bumping. He still nearly got the head bob at 12-1. Was 3 behind the same runner that beat choice when 5th in G3 With Anticipation in the 2nd start. She broke slowly and stayed near the back on a track favoring speed. This race was one of four straight in which the top 3 speeds ran 1,2,3. Winner of the G2 Starlet (for Baffert) is now 4 for 5 after she crushed in the G3 Las Virgenes. Working fast for this one and is why she shipped.</p> <p>VALUE: 8 ADMIT 2nd dam on the female side (Preach) won the G1 Frizette in 1991 and ran in this race in 1992 for the same owners. The sire beat Zenyatta in the '10 BC Classic for Claiborne. She ran pretty well on the synthetic at Turfway. Couldn't get a bigger rider change from Moncada to Jose Ortiz. She should be able to stalk the pace out side. Will be an overlay.</p> <p>A) 1,4 B) 5,6,7,8 C) 2,3 D)</p>	<p>10 – KEENELAND (5:48 ET) 57 STARTER ALLOWANCE 63K, 7F DIRT</p> <p>5 MIZMALICE 15-1 3 MOOCHIE GIRL 15-1 6 BREAD TO RUN 9-2 11 GOLDEN IRISH 7-2</p> <p>PICK: 5 MIZMALICE If you draw the conclusion that she doesn't like any give in the ground (turf or synthetic) and prefers the main track, she looks pretty good in this context. Winner 3 back was 2nd less than a length in the 200k Busher at AQU on 3/1. Runner-up was 2nd in the G2 Rachel Alexandra and took the Bourbonette at TP. 3rd won two allowance at FG since.</p> <p>VALUE: 3 MOOCHIE GIRL There are 3 fillies out of the same race at TP this one was last in (that includes the top choice). This one was clear of the others when 4th (although well beaten). Has some late kick when sprinting and she'll be able to show that in here.
