Timber Country, never far back while well in hand to the end of the backstretch, angled out from behind the leaders while rallying approaching the stretch, caught the leaders while five wide with a furlong remaining and prevailed under strong handling.

Oliver's Twist steadied slightly following the start, was well placed along the inside to the far turn, was blocked behind the leaders from the five-sixteenths pole until inside the final three sixteenths and, after splitting Star Standard and Talkin Man a furlong out, finished strongly along the indside.

Thunder Gulch came over slightly on Oliver's Twist following the start, remained within easy striking distance to the far turn, angled out to loom a threat between horses through the upper stretch and continued on with good courage.

Star Standard, bumped after the start prompted the pace while racing just outside Mystery Storm, headed that rival from between horses with five-sixteenths remaining, held on well until inside the final furlong and weakened.

Mecke ducked in bumping Star Standard after the start, moved up along the inside around the far turn, came out for the drive but failed to sustain his rally.

Talkin Man, away alertly, eased out three wide racing into the first turn, made a run at the leaders approaching the stretch, held on well to midstretch and tired.

Our Gatsby, badly outrun to the far turn, failed to be a serious factor.

Mystery Storm saved ground while showing good early foot, held on well to the top of the stretch and gave way.

Tejano Run, within striking distance for a half, tired badly.

Pana Brass raced wide.

Itron, fractious in the gate unseating his rider, stopped badly.
