The following Kentucky Derby Chart is transmitted in single column for two column use by butting alternate lines.

Off 5:40 1/2, 3-10-13 (Pgm4-7 10). Time 2:02. Cloudy & Fast, 15 went. Start good, ridden out. 5.80 4.40 3.60 9.20 5.60 4.40.

Foolish Pleasure away in good order but taken under stout restraint and allowed to drop far back, continued along inside while being unhurried for five furlongs. Commenced to advance from inner railing thereafter with a rush, split rivals in a quick maneuver midway of second turn, continued to advance steadily into stretch at which point he was eased out wider to engage leaders nearing furlong marker, disposed of that pair when sharply roused in midstretch and drew off under intermittent urging. Avatar gained a forward position at once, continued slightly wide while prompting the issued own the backstretch, came in on final bend to duel with Diabolo for lead, Responded well after being soundly bumped and knocked off stride nearing furlong marker to again bump with Diabolo but was unable to stay with winner through final drive. Diabolo in hand early, moved up steadily from outside on rounding second turn to gain a narrow advantage on final bend, continued slightly wide while duelling for lead until nearing furlong marker at which point he took a bad stride to swerve into Avatar, was in turn soundly bumped by that one and dropped back steadily thereafter. Diabolo pulled up lame while bleeding profusely from a cut just below the knee of the left foreleg. A stewards inquiry into the bumping mishap between Avatar and Diabolo nearing the furlong marker failed to alter the results as it was determined Diabolo was the originator of the bumping. Master Derby unhurried early, continued in slightly close quarters nearing the first turn, advanced from outside through run down backstretch to loom boldly on entering and through upper stretch only to falter through the drive. Media ducked sharply to the inside soon after the start, swerved out while being straightened, improved his position steadily after three quarters but posed no threat. Prince Thou Art void of early speed as usual, rallied from outside on second turn but lacked an effectual response. Sylvan Place tired after being in contention for a mile. Fashion Sale showed some early speed, was caught in close quarters leaving backstretch and dropped back steadily. Rushing Man dropped back swiftly after being forced into the inner railing by Bombay duck on leaving the backstretch. Bombay Duck sent to fore at once, raced slightly removed from inner railing to avoid the fans lining the inner railing through run down back stretch, cut over sharply on entering second turn and dropped back steadily thereafter.
