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<p>1 – KEENELAND (1:00 ET) 74 MAIDEN SPECIAL 90K, 4.5F DIRT (SLOPPY)</p> <p>12 DAPHNE BLUE 8-5 11 THE LITTLE SULTANA 20-1 4 HONOR AND OBEY 20-1 9 KADABRA 3-1</p> <p>PICK: 12 DAPHNE BLUE Wesley Ward stats in spots like this are unreal. He's 19 for 41 (46%) with 31 ITM (76%), positive \$2.20 ROI with a debut 2YO on the dirt sprinting at KEE in MSW. He is 6 for 10 with such with Joel Rosario up. Sire gets 14% with debut 2YO's and 18% in dirt sprints overall. Dam and 2 siblings trained by Ward won in debut here at KEE at 4.5F.</p> <p>VALUE: 11 THE LITTLE SULTANA These 4.5F baby races at KEE are less about overall talent and more about who is ready right now. This trainer had a first timer at 4.5F in MSW win here (from the 11 post) almost exactly a year ago at 45-1 (graded stakes winner The Queens M G). The workouts leading up to that debut were similar to these works. Awful break three back cost him the break. Only other time on a fast dirt track other than the win last time out was when he was 3rd to G3 Tampa Bay Derby winner, Owen Almighty. Gets a massive rider upgrade to Jose Ortiz. 3rd place in the last start returned to win at the same level at Tampa Bay.</p> <p>VALUE: 9 FARLEY HALL Lost footing at the break of the last start and was awkward in the early stages losing momentum. He basically eased after that. Caught some traffic in the stakes at OP 2 back. Prior dirt starts for Miller were quite good. 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<p>5 – KEENELAND (3:08 ET) 60 ALLOWANCE 130K, 1M 1/16 *OFF TURF* (SLOPPY)</p> <p>2 JUST BETTER 12-1 10 CHILLED 30-1 13 BROUGHTY FERRY 30-1 5 SERENE SERAPH 15-1</p> <p>PICK: 2 JUST BETTER Steve Asmussen filly has not run a bad race in her career. She's been 1st or 2nd in 5 of 6 and the only miss into the exacta was two back in a stakes at CD. Relished her lone attempt on an off track here when she on an allowance 1 year ago, She has tactical speed and the inside so expect her to send to hold position. 2nd start off a long layoff here.</p> <p>VALUE: 10 CHILLED She was 0 for 2 on the turf and 1 for 3 on the off-track. So maybe the move to the sloppy main track will benefit her in this spot. She won two back at CD at 9-2 over a similar field. Didn't run too poorly in her other two tries on a wet dirt track (beaten 2.5 and 7 lengths). Ran well enough in her last comebacker when 3rd here in a MSW at near 30-1.</p> <p>A) 2,10 B) 5,13,14 C) D)</p>	<p>6 – KEENELAND (3:40 ET) 47 OPTIONAL CLAIMING 125K, 1M 1/16 DIRT (SLOPPY)</p> <p>5 RUTH 15-1 4 LIAM IN THE DUST 9-2 9 JUSTINQUESO 7-2 3 GETTING AFTER IT 15-1</p> <p>PICK: 5 RUTH Todd Pletcher filly was bet heavily first time out at GP in a route and she won rather easily from off-the-pace. Lost a real chance in the Busanda two back when she stumbled quite severely at the break. Added blinkers in the last start when she ran evenly at nearly 7-1. Uncle Mo is a very nice off-track sire. Todd Pletcher has trained a lot of Uncle Mo's.</p> <p>VALUE: 4 LIAM IN THE DUST She fired in 4 of 6 starts but duds in the other two. That includes last time out when she was last in the Busher at Aqueduct as the 2-1 favorite. That was her first start with blinkers so maybe that threw her off a bit. Scratched out of the G3 Gazelle at Aqueduct on Saturday to run in this spot. She has a steady stream of works over this dirt track.</p> <p>A) 4,5,9 B) 1,2,3 C) 7,8 D) 6</p>	<p>7 – KEENELAND (4:12 ET) 74 MAIDEN SPECIAL 110K, 1M 1/16 DIRT (SLOPPY)</p> <p>2 SALTED 3-1 8 HIGH NOTE 8-1 1 HEAVENLY SUNSET 4-1 10 LADY SCUDERIA 6-1</p> <p>PICK: 2 SALTED Dam was a G1 winner who was 5th in the 2017 G1 Ky Oaks behind Abel Tasman. They paid 760k for her as a yearling. Only poor run came in the G1 Spinaway on a muddy track two back. Casse must feel she is of quality to enter her in that G1 as a maiden. Winner of the 2nd start (Immersive) was the champion 2YO filly (undefeated, won 3 Grade 1's).</p> <p>VALUE: 8 HIGH NOTE Have a hard time believing she is as flat as she looked in the Tampa debut. She was 8-5 and never really was in the race. Cost 450k as a sib to the 2013 Grade 1 Wood and Haskell winner, Verrazano. Another sib, El Padrino, Won the G2 Risen Star in 2012. Brown is 7 for 15 (47%) with first time blinkers in a dirt route for a 2nd timer in a MSW.</p> <p>A) 1,2,8 B) 6,9 C) 3,5,11,13 D) 7</p>
<p>8 – KEENELAND (4:44 ET) 63 PALISADES 300K, 5.5F *OFF TURF* (SLOPPY)</p> <p>3 NORMANDY COAST 20-1 1 LONG NECK PAULA 10-1 9 KILLJOY 20-1 6 TURBULENT FORCE 6-1</p> <p>PICK: 3 NORMANDY COAST Draw a line through the G3 Gotham. He stumbled in there at the start and was eased. Won the prior two starts for Eddie Kenneally and the win two back came with this rider aboard. Figures to pull into the race early into a good box seat spot. Sire was 2 for 2 on a sloppy track having won the G1 Arkansas Derby on a similar surface. Dirt is better.</p> <p>VALUE: 1 LONG NECK PAULA Wesley Ward filly has already beaten males. She won vs. males two back on the dirt track here. Pop and stop as the favorite in the Serena's Song at TP last time out. She looks better than that run and should move forward in this spot. Has the ideal running style for the way this race will shake out. Not easy to navigate the rail at 5.5F on the dirt though.</p> <p>A) 1,3,9 B) 6 C) 7,11 D)</p>	<p>9 – KEENELAND (5:16 ET) 79 BEAUMONT (G2) 400K, 7F DIRT (SLOPPY)</p> <p>5 STUNNER 3-1 4 CONTINUITY 12-1 3 GW'S GIRL 2-1 6 VERITY 9-2</p> <p>PICK: 5 STUNNER Pretty deep field for a 6-horse affair. This one has a lot of speed and might be able to control the pace. She was out in the widest 11 post on the cutback in last and had to go wide. She made an early move to the front before getting run down by the stablemate on the rail. Back to back wins in NY were strong. Prat up in the maiden win and is back.</p> <p>VALUE: 4 CONTINUITY Jumped up off the maiden win at ELP and crushed a group of decent fillies at CNL two back. The runner-up from that race ran 2nd in an opt clm here at KEE at 23-1 next before she won a 100k stakes at Tampa. Loaded running of the G1 Alcibiades. 1st and 2nd were 1st and 3rd in the G1 BC Juv Fillies. 3rd won the Honeybee and Fantasy at OP recently.</p> <p>A) 3,4,5 B) 6 C) 2 D)</p>	<p>10 – KEENELAND (5:48 ET) 68 ALLOWANCE 150K, 1M 1/8 *OFF TURF* (SLOPPY)</p> <p>3 DETERMINISTIC 9-2 12 LAGYNOS 8-1 10 MONEY SUPPLY 20-1 6 STRONG QUALITY 7-2</p> <p>PICK 3 DETERMINISTIC Multiple Grade 3 winner on the turf and Grade 1 placed in the Saratoga Derby. Runner-up in the last start came back to win a 125k stakes at GP on the turf. This trainer won a similar allowance condition here last year with Rosario up at 5-2 odds. 625k purchase won the Gotham in just his 2nd start. That was a very sloppy track and he just relished it.</p> <p>VALUE: 12 LAGYNOS Won over a sloppy track in the last start at FG. That was a similar type of field and track and he was drawing away in the end. Has always had a bit of class to him. He's been in stakes in 11 straight starts before today.
