Rachel Alexandra — broke to outside, then was quickly straightened, moved up and disputed pace 4-wide outside Big Drama while under light hold, opened clear lead in upper stretch, increased advantage under stout lefthanded urging in midstretch, then was fully extended to prevail.

Mine That Bird — unhurried early, raced removed from rail leaving the 5/8ths pole, moved quickly to contention leaving 3 furlong marker, steadied behind wall of rivals nearing quarter pole, swung out 7-wide into lane and closed gamely to be gaining on winner.

Musket Man — settled in good position along rail, moved closer leaving 3/8ths pole, steadied briefly nearing quarter pole, angled out in midstretch, made steady progress but was outfinished.

Flying Private — was steadied off heels of Tone It Down nearing wire the first time, settled back toward inside down backstretch, steadied briefly when making run approaching stretch, angled out midstretch and continued on willingly.

Big Drama — fractious at gate, bobbled to front at start, vied 3-wide inside winner, held well to midstretch, then gave way grudgingly.

Papa Clem — stalked pace while saving ground, eased out 3-wide entering stretch, remained in contention to 3/16ths marker, then flattened out.

Terrain — unhurried early, gained between rivals leaving 5/16ths marker, steadied briefly when in a bit tight entering lane, then lacked needed finishing repsonse.

Luv Gov — saved ground early, swung 8-wide in drive and passed fading rivals.

General Quarters — shuffled back early, moved up between rivals under rating past 5 furlong marker, continued between foes into stretch, steadied and was forced out some, leaving 3/16ths pole, then gave way.

Friesan Fire — bobbled at break, quickly recovered and reached striking position into first turn, angled out 4-wide for run down backstretch, was put a ride midway on final turn, tired through drive.

Pioneerof the Nile — caught 5-wide between rivals while stalking pace, continued forwardly to far turn, dropped back nearing lane, swung out widest in upper stretch, tired and was eased late.

Tone It Down — was angled in early, settled under rating while 2-wide past ¾ pole, faltered leaving far turn and was eased late.

Take the Points — was hung out 6-wide to far turn, faltered, then was eased through stretch.
