California Chrome — broke alertly, angled out path when Pablo Del Monte dropped in early, straightened to follow leaders into first turn, was guided 3-wide soon after to take stalking position, commenced run when given cue into far turn, took over between rivals just past ¾ pole, withstood outside pressure from Social Inclusion, shook clear of that rival entering stretch, spurted away when roused right handed then held sway under pressure.

Ride On Curlin — settled in clear with 2- to 3-wide, angled out when edging closed into far turn, made nice 4-wide run approaching the ¼ pole, straightended and gave willing chase and was well clear for place.

Social Inclusion — was floated out bit when winner angled out in early stages, was taken 4-wide into backstretch, moved in tandem with winner three furlongs out, remained sharp factor to upper stretch. Failed to sustain in final furlong and lasted for show.

General a Rod — gained forward position along the rail into the first turn, eased out and pulled way to contention while between rivals near ½-mile pole, had run stymied when shuffled back into far turn, regrouped to save ground past 5/16ths, altered out mid stretch and finished with good energy.

Ring Weekend — exchanged bumps with Bayern shortly after break, was taken in hand then steadied briefly entering clubhouse turn, dropped to rail for backstretch run, quickly gained heading towards ½-mile pole, followed leaders under urging nearing ¼ pole, shifted out in upper stretch then went evenly in final ½th.

Pablo Del Monte — angled in when going clear past wire initial time, was joined from outside by Ria Antonio after ¼ mile, briefly shook clear after six furlongs, was engaged soon after, battled inside foes to 5/16 marker then steadily gave way.

Dynamic Impact — was taken off rail soon after break, gained 2-wide nearing $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile marker, failed to go on when put to strong urging on turn and gave way.

Kid Cruz — dropped well off early pace while 2- to 3-wide, failed to generate significant response and could only get past tired rivals.

Bayern — bobbled then was pinched back at break, exchanged bumps with Ring Weekend, angled out making contact with Ria Antonia heading towards wire first time, steadied briefly off heels, lost ground 3- to 4-wide, gained into far turn, remained in contention past % pole then had nothing left to give.

Ria Antonia — leaned in at break bumping and tightening foes, came in again soon after, shifted out then bumped with Bayern, straightened to move up 5-wide under own courage, dropped in few paths and collared leader, pressed pace to far turn and retired.
