Tank's Prospect brushed with I Am The Game soon after the start causing his rider to lose his left iron briefly, saved ground into the backstretch, moved back to the inside to continue his rally after going around Sport Jet and Tajawa midway of the far turn, then came out leaving the furlong grounds and wore down Chief's Crown under strong left-handed urging.

Chief's Crown, reserved into the backstretch, made a run from the outside approaching the far turn, caught Eternal Prince nearing the stretch, then failed to last after gaining a clear advantage near the final furlong.

Eternal Prince quickly sprinted clear, made the pace while saving ground, remained prominent to the upper stretch and weakened. I Am The Game, never far back, moved menacingly around horses on the far turn but lacked a further response.

Cutlass Reality failed to be a serious factor. Tajawa, away alertly, raced forwardly into the backstretch while saving ground but was finished soon after going five furlongs. Southern Sultan, away slowly, was never close. Sparrowvon, off slowly, was always outrun.

Skip Trial had no apparent excuse. Sport Jet raced forwardly until near the end of the backstretch and stopped badly. Hajji's Treasure, close up early, broke down entering the backstretch.
