PICK: 5 SHE'S AN EARNER

Get the feeling she may have bled in the debut. She was very flat late after checking at the start. She moves here to FG where she is able to procure Lasix for the first time (a bleeder medication). Asmussen with a couple of sharp works followed by a slow 3F breeze before the race is an indicator of readiness. Should expect a big move forward.

VALUE: 8 RAGING CURRENT

Quite a few of these come out of the 11/21 FG MSW at the 5F distance on the turf. It depends how strong that race turns out to be whether this one will compete. She really moved up on the move to the grass last out. It was also her first with Lasix. She drew the 11 post and got a 6 wide trip but was only a bit over 3-lengths off the top in the end.

PICK: 1 MISSIN MISSY

Strong debut here a month ago. She pressed the pace in the early stages and grinded home for a 9-2 placing to a winner who returned to run 2nd in 125k Lassie (74 Beyer). Third ran third in a MSW routing on the turf here next. 7th beaten 12 was 2nd in a mdn clm 20k next. Trainer won by 11 (with Pedroza) last time he had a 2nd timer (on 12/6).

PICK: 8 BRAKEN POPPA

Another Asmussen two-year old filly making her second career start. Asmussen is 23 for 87 (26%) with a second time starter in a MSW sprinting on the dirt after running in the money in the debut. His horses have been firing at every track recently. Paco Lopez back in the irons here. She's bred for speed. The dam produced 2 quarterhorses.

PICK: 3 GOLDEN TEMPO

First time starter with an exceptional pedigree. This is an Ogden Phipps female line. A few generations back in the female lineage is the great Heavenly Prize (\$1.8M, won 8 Grade 1's) and the superstar Dancing Spree (\$1.4M, won the 1989 BC Sprint). Trainer won 3 of 4 first time starters including one at CD sprinting on the dirt with Jose Ortiz.

VALUE: 10 HOT DAYS AHEAD

Dallas Stewart is quite good with second timers. This one was 63-1 in a strong MSW at CD. He broke awkwardly and was climbing in the early stages. Adds Lasix for the first time in here after making up ground late. Sib to the Bob Baffert G1 winner Tenma. Second dam won turf stakes for Aidan O'Brien. Expecting a major form reversal today.

PICK: 6 WHITE SMOKE Cherie DeVaux has two first time starters in here. Her top call rider (Jose Ortiz) is on the other one. But this jockey (Nieves) was up just once for DeVaux. It was a 48-1 win in a MSW on the turf going a mile earlier this month with a first timer. One sib (Promise Keeper) is a multiple graded stakes winner and another was a stakes winner on the dirt.		PICK: 7 AWESOMESAUCE Joe Sharp isn't known for winning on the turf in MSW at a route but he is 1 for 5 with such here at FG. He was also second in another. Those two live runners were 15-1 and 26-1. Ohio-bred has a tremendous turf pedigree with the legendary Northern Dancer bloodlines on both sides of the family. Has some good works for this. Paco Lopez up.		PICK: 10 TAPIT'S GUNNER Dallas Stewart has had 20 first time MSW starters going a sprint on the dirt here at FG. He won 5 of them (25%) at odds of 45-1, 25-1, 18-1, 9-1, 6-1. Two of those wins were with Brian Hernandez riding. The 2005 G1 Test winner is in the female line. Supersire Gun Runner gets 20% with two-year old firsters (the national average for that is 11%).	
VALUE: 2 SPEIGHTRESS Another well-bred Dallas Stewart second timer. See how #10 Hot Days Ahead runs in race 3 (also a second timer getting Lasix). This one ran like she bled. She flashed good speed but stopped abruptly in the debut at CD. Lasix for the first time and draws a good post. Has mostly turf in the female line. Really sharp 4F work since the last start.		VALUE: 1 ENTICING BEAUTY Trainer Ken McPeek cut her back in distance and moved to the grass in the last start. She was last for much of the race before starting a run in the stretch to get beaten four lengths. This pedigree is more for the routes so that last start was just a test to see if she could handle the grass. She will save ground from the rail. Use her in the supers.		VALUE: 5 SOCKDOLAGER This one was 10-1 in the first start in a full field of MSW's at CD. He ran evenly beaten about 8-lengths while 4-wide in there. Major addition of Lasix. Trainer Joe Sharp wins at 22% at FG with second time starters getting Lasix for the first time. Dam was a long distance turf runner. Rider Paco Lopez is 11 for 31 riding for Sharp (35%). Consider.

PICK: 1 LOOK NO MO There really isn't much obvious speed in the race. Given that this one is stretching out from a sprint, moving from a wide post to the rail and retaining an inexperienced rider for this, look for him to be sent to the front. There are a lot of distance turf stakes winners in the family. Debut placing indicates talent. Best chance is to spurt away on the front.		PICK: 7 NOT THIS BOY Absolutely major scratch of the morning line favorite in here (#2 Just a Touch). That makes this one quite a bit of a standout. He's 8 for 8 in the money and fired off Beyers of 100 or more in 2 of his last 3 starts. In fact, he's never had a Beyer below 94 routing. That 94 came in his most recent start when 3 rd at 4-5 odds. Reportedly working well.		PICK: 2 KUPUNA Moved to the turf for just the second time last out at CD. He was allowed to get away at 15-1 but got the win. It is possible the pace could be contested and may set it up for his late move. 600k earner was in the Epicenter G2 La Derby here in 2022. Trainer Norm Casse having a strong year with 20% wins. Figures to fall into a pretty good trip.	
VALUE: 12 MATCHING FUNDS First time starter didn't get dealt a very good hand with the widest post in this full field. But if Loveberry can get him to save some ground, he could be a major player in here. Dam won her debut routing on the turf for the same connections in 2015 at AP. Consistent worktab is typical for a live Block first time starter. Assess tote for more clues.		VALUE: 1 KOMOREBINO OMOIDE He's a 766k earner for high percentage trainer Robertino Diodoro. Sprinted in the last start which was simply a prep for this. He ran pretty well considering sprinting isn't the ideal distance for him. Notice he did the same thing last year before a runner-up in the G3 Louisiana on this track at 15-1. The aggressive Paco Lopez will get in this early on.		VALUE: 8 IDRATHERBEBLESSED No question he's a bleeder and needs Lasix (it is allowed at FG). He bled and was driven away in the ambulance 2 back. Clearly needed the last start off the layoff. Thinking the other speed will let him have the front. Career best came here in the G2 win four back. Was right with the #9 Gigante a few times last year. Early pace will decide this.

PICK: 7 PASHMINA <p>There really isn't any turf breeding on this one. So the first start can be overlooked. In addition to not having any turf in the pedigree, she drew the 12 post and was very wide in that race. Moved to the dirt and won for fun last time out. She went for 3 1/2 times the sire fee back 14 months ago at the Oct 2024 sale. Third start. Can improve yet again today.</p> <p>VALUE: 1 LUV YOUR NEIGHBOR Two very good starts around a pop and stop fade on the polytrack at Woodbine. It's possible she didn't care for it and faded. Sire is Constitution so the stretch out to this distance should be ideal. Sib to Faber. He third in a pair of 400k stakes going 1M 1/2 or longer. Winner of the most recent start was an Amoss 2nd timer who went off at 1-5.</p> <p>A) 1,3,7 B) 6,8 C) 2,5 D) 4</p>		PICK: 3 LIBERTY NATIONAL <p>Ken McPeek is 5 for 20 (25%) with a solid \$3.03 RO and 11 in the money (55%) with a last out winner into non-graded stakes routing on the dirt. Sire fee just 40k but sold for 525k at the '24 Kee Sep sale. The female family produced Tiznow (2x BC Classic winner, \$6.4M earner) and G1 type Budroyale (\$2.8M earner). Top call rider for McPeek is up.</p> <p>VALUE: 7 VERY CONNECTED This is another in the race for McPeek. After the maiden win 3 back, he was in back to back graded stakes at CD in the last couple of months. He was 13-1 when third in the G3 Street Sense and 34-1 when a close 4th in the G2 last time out. This one is a deep closer. He'll be coming from far off the pace in here. Form is good enough to compete.</p> <p>A) 1,3,7 B) 2,8 C) 5 D) 4</p>		PICK: 12 ROGUISHNESS <p>He had a terrible trip in the debut. Added blinkers for the second start and stretched out. Jose Ortiz got up and he ran second despite a slow start. Had little chance to run down the top two last out. It was a merry-go-round race as the top two were that way from the start. Sib Botanical was a multiple stakes winner who ran in the G1 Ky Oaks.</p> <p>VALUE: 4 KELZ Tried the turf in the debut. He drew the 11 post in there and made up some late ground while not really much of a threat. McPeek is 8 for 24 (33%) going turf to dirt with a second time starter. That includes 3 wins in the last 4 tries of that sort. Certainly has a dirt pedigree and should move forward on this move.
